HOW LAMMP CAN HELP INVESTIGATORS

The LAMMP database allows investigators to have access to compare missing persons to unidentified persons who are included in our database with mapped locations and side by side comparison capabilities. The LAMMP database includes genealogical information when available which can assist in the identification of unidentified persons, or with next of kin notifications. The LAMMP database also includes members of the LGBTQ+ community who have not been officially reported as missing to a Law Enforcement Agency, but who are known to be missing to family, friends, or to the community. Because this information is private, LAMMP may be the only source of information. Additionally, the Trans Doe Task Force can act as liaisons between the local LGBTQ+ community and Law Enforcement Agencies so they can work together to help locate or identify missing people and unidentified LGBTQ+ Persons.

HOW LAMMP CAN HELP FAMILIES AND FRIENDS OF MISSING LGBTQ+ PEOPLE

The LAMMP database's missing persons section is private and only available to approved people with appropriate access. These professionals include Medical Examiners, Forensic Anthropologists, Coroners, and Missing Persons Detectives. We allow entry of missing LGTBQ+ people, sex workers, and people involved in the kink community, regardless of whether or not an official police report has been filed. This allows for chosen family, friends, and community members to get help even if they have struggled with filing an official report. The LAMMP administrator can also help enter your loved ones details into the National Missing and Unidentified Persons database at NamUs.gov if an official report has been filed, as well as advise you on appropriate next steps to take. Additionally, LAMMP can create missing persons fliers, and social media posts to help circulate your loved one's information. We collaborate with grassroots missing persons groups around the world, and local LGBTQ+ community members to help ensure that information about your missing loved one reaches the people who can best help locate them safely.

HOW LAMMP CAN HELP PEOPLE WHO ARE AFRAID THEY WILL GO MISSING

The LAMMP Database recently launched our "If I Go Missing" database, which is for LGBTQ+ themselves to privately host their information in case they go missing in the future. This information can include information about their lived identity, because so often when LGBTQ+ go missing, that information is either not known, or absent from media coverage regarding their disappearance. We provide this service to our community because of the increased levels of violence we are currently experiencing. This information is 100% private and will not be disclosed unless the participating LGBTQ+ person either goes missing or is found deceased.
